

Toyota Will Discontinue Operations at its CAPTIN Wheel Manufacturing Plant in November 2021

Toyota to exit Wheel Manufacturing Business in North America

(Aug. 19, 2020) PLANO, TX – Today, Toyota Motor North America (TMNA) announced the closure of its CAPTIN wheel manufacturing facility in Delta, British Columbia, Canada. All 160 employees have been offered either employment at Toyota Motor Manufacturing Canada or a competitive severance package.

This decision is in line with Toyota's focus on delivering competitive and technological solutions to become a leading global mobility company.

"The employees at our CAPTIN facility have provided exceptional products and services to the Toyota organization and we appreciate all the contributions they have made to the company," said Chris Reynolds, chief administrative officer, Manufacturing & Corporate Resources, TMNA. "Toyota's decision to exit the wheel manufacturing business in North America has been made in order to better focus on our core business: delivering mobility solutions that meet the changing needs of our consumers."

Production at the CAPTIN facility will continue until November 2021.
